

LANDCARE GROUP DETAILS

The Gelantipy Landcare Group formed in 1998 and the group area covers 10,987 hectares. This area encompasses Butcher's Ridge, Gelantipy, Wulgulmerang and Black Mountain. The group is situated approximately 100km north east of the City of Bairnsdale.

The Gelantipy Landcare Group administer the employment of the Mid-Snowy Pest Plant and Animal Coordinator, who services three Landcare Groups. This position is responsible for property weed management planning, bulk herbicide purchases, organising cross property aerial weed spraying and advice on weed management.

The Gelantipy Landcare Group is one of 23 Landcare Groups operating under the banner of the East Gippsland Landcare Network.

LANDCARE ACTIVITIES

The Gelantipy Landcare Group currently has a membership base of 28 families.

Two Landcare meetings were held during the 2011-12 financial year, which were the Group's AGM followed by a General Meeting and updating of the Group's Action Plan and Calendar of Activities for the following financial year.

Individual members were involved on the East Gippsland Landcare Network's General Committee.

Other members were involved with the East Gippsland Landcare Network Inc. Tree Project; completing fencing and revegetation activities on their properties.

LANDCARE OUTCOMES

Gelantipy Landcare Group's bank balance was \$36,067.97 at the end of the 2011-12 financial year.

One notice for meetings and activities was distributed to all members.

In-kind support from members and other participants during the year totalled \$770.00.

The Group secured funding of \$13,120.00 through the State Government's Victorian Landcare Grants Program for Natural Resources Management in the Snowy River Catchment Project. This funding allows the Pest Plant and Animal Coordinator to advise and assist three local Landcare Groups; Buchan, Gelantipy and Timbarra Landcare Groups. This is completed via property management plans and pest plant and animal management advice. The Pest Plant and Animal Coordinator also organises the bulk purchase of herbicides and cross property aerial spraying activities.
